Triumph of Orthodoxy Icon Procession

The 1st Sunday of Lent calls us to remember the Triumph of our faith at the 7th Ecumenical Council over the false teachings that encourage the disregarding and disdaining of holy images for the sake of worldly ideas. It's a day to celebrate how the Lord has given us the image of Himself, His Mother, and all the saints for us to kiss and bow before. The icons are the reminder and encouragement to us about our Savior's closeness and love, along with all of His favorites: the saints. On Sunday, March 5, 2023, we will sing and process with the holy icons around the church at the completion of the Divine Liturgy.

Parishioners can bring icons of their patron saints or other beloved icons from home. We should take care to wrap the icons in a towel or some other kind of protection so they are not damaged leading up to the procession. Children should be instructed in how to hold the icons and watched so as to prevent them from accidentally dropping the holy images.
